

MSCF Delegate Assembly Information

If a chapter or individual member would like to submit a New Business item, Resolution, or a Constitution & Bylaw amendment, it must be received by the MSCF office no later than Friday, March 13, 2019. All items should be emailed to llissa Morrow at llissa.morrow@edmn.org or faxed to 651-767-1266.

What is a Resolution?

A resolution is a statement of Minnesota State College Faculty philosophy and intended goal, transitory or long term, as developed by its members and approved by the Delegate Assembly, which shall serve as a guide for the direction of its professional officers, committees, and administrative organization.

What is a Current and Standing Resolution?

Current resolutions are presented to the delegates at the Delegate Assembly to be enacted as a policy of direction for the officers, committees, and administrative organization. Current resolutions once passed become standing resolutions the following year. Standing resolutions remain in effect unless rescinded by the Delegate Assembly.

What is New Business?

A motion that directs an individual or group of individuals to take specific action is a new business item--not a resolution.

What is the Procedure?

A set of operating rules have been developed and adopted by previous Delegate Assemblies. These spell out the procedures to be followed. Changing or accepting these rules is the obligation and responsibility of the Delegate Assembly.

What is a resolution caucus?

A resolution caucus is an informal meeting of interested parties, immediately prior to the start of the Delegate Assembly, for the purpose of discussing and finding common ground on proposed resolutions. This is an opportunity to resolve technical issues, discuss similar or competing resolutions, and collaborate on potential solutions to be brought to the Delegate Assembly.
